PROTECT, PRESERVE, MAINTAIN OUR BENEFITS

hese are the words that describe the best that NARFE could do for us during 2012. It is not surprising that salaries/ \Rightarrow annuities and benefits for us Feds have not improved during the 112th Congress in view of the federal budget and Increasing deficit. Perhaps we can be grateful that current active employees NARFE headquarters staff also has haven't been "hit" more than they have. helped Perhaps some credit can be given to our National Office for their continuing negotiations with Congress on our Governments as they deal with their behalf.

NARFE publication In а recent summarized some of its efforts to shield us from adverse actions by Congress. Listed among NARFE's accomplishments are the following:

- ⇒ **Defeated the Step Increase Freeze** that would have expanded the two-year pay freeze to include merit-awarded step increases.
- ⇒ Prevented retirement, pay and benefit cuts which now will not reduce employee and annuitant compensation. even though threats are likely to continue.
- ⇒ Protected Retirement Contributions for **Current Feds from Increase. Its passage** would have increased contributions toward their retirement without enhanced benefit.
- ⇒ Backed the Passage of the New Phased **Retirement Option Law that now allows** employees to transition to part-time work while collecting a partial annuity.
- ⇒ Maintained FEHBP Integrity. An amendment in the Senate postal reform legislation would have removed postal retirees from the FEHBP and forced them into Medigap plans. This proposal

would have raised premiums on all **FEHBP** participants.

Testified Before Congress six times on issues such as the retirement claims backlog, federal compensation, and on behalf of the 30-member Federal-Postal Coalition.

by training various state Federation leaders on how to become more effective in dealing with State various deficits and attempts to balance budgets.

NARFE has answered hundreds of personal auestions submitted members from all over the country. Timely and reliable answers to complex questions have become harder to get from many agency personnel offices in view of staff cutbacks, etc. encourages queries and has experience in dealing with unusual situations. few are answered in the NARFE Magazine and are periodically published in a compendium. They answer questions most of us haven't even thought of yet, such as: Is it worth it in terms of annuity payout to pay my military deposit before I retire? Or, I'm in the middle of divorce, what do I need to know about how my benefits will be affected? Can I cover my grandchild as an eligible dependent under my FEHBP? I am nearing retirement and am a CSRS-Offset employee. How will this affect my retirement? And finally, should I enroll in Medicare when I become eligible?

ALZHEIMER'S REPORT Creavery Lloyd, Alzheimer's Chair

An article in Everyday Health, by Staff Writer Annie Hauser stated that Researchers found **Green Tea Could Block Alzheimer's Disease Plaque.** Read below:

"Finding ways to slow the growth of the amyloid peptide, or plaque, in Alzheimer's patients' brains is one of the key challenges facing Alzheimer's research. Now scientists at the University of Michigan say they might have found a new way to stop plaque growth -

- and slow the progress of the disease -- using a specific molecule in green tea. Their laboratory results, which are extremely preliminary, are published in the Proceedings of the National Academy of Science. As for the new research,



lead author Mi Hee Lim, Ph.D., notes in the study the long-established power of EGCG and other flavonoids in green tea for fighting brain-damaging free radicals and preventing memory loss. According to a 2012 study published in the Journal of Phytotherapy and Phytopharacology, there is significant evidence that free radicals play a role in the development of Alzheimer's disease, and that the polyphenols in green tea can help fight these free radicals.

As is true with any new research, before starting any non-prescribed remedy/treatment/regime, one should ALWAYS consult their primary care physician first to ensure there will be no contradictions or adverse reactions."

House Passes Continuing Resolution

While the threat of a late winter Washington storm closed most of the Executive Branch (and NARFE), in mid March, the House passed a \$984 billion Continuing Resolution (CR), funding government operations for the remainder of fiscal year 2013. The CR, H.R. 933, included a provision freezing federal pay through the end of calendar year 2013. The vote was 267-151. The bill funds the government at the sequester levels, doing nothing to prevent the widespread furloughs throughout most federal agencies that are set to take effect in April. The Senate is likely to consider small changes to the bill; but, in the hope of preventing a government shutdown, it is unlikely to make any major changes.

Sequestration Threatens Federal Workforce Furloughs, Vital Services

Joseph A. Beaudoin, president of the National Active and Retired Federal Employees Association (NARFE), released the following statement:

"For nearly two years, the outcome that was once thought to be too poisonous to be possible, now appears to be embraced by politicians who are ignoring the severe impact it will have on the millions of middle-class federal employees subject to this unending cycle of political gamesmanship.

"It is unthinkable that our elected officials would allow vital services provided by America's federal employees to falter. The safety of our food and skies, the protection of our borders, the capacity to respond to citizens with tax questions, the ability to warn us of impending natural disasters and the conservation of our public lands have become the latest casualties of kickthe-can politics.

"In addition to Congress' unwillingness to do its job, there is a growing indifference to the economic impact that furloughs will have on federal employees across this country. These workers — who, on average, have already sacrificed \$49,000 per employee to help alleviate our nation's budget crisis — are facing the prospect of losing 20 percent of their modest income for the remainder of the fiscal year.

"The critical work of millions of dedicated federal workers can no longer be a bargaining chip in the absence of political will. The time for bipartisan leadership is now. We hope an agreement is reached before federal employees in every congressional district are furloughed, resulting in a slash to middle-class household incomes and our national protection."
