ALZHEIMER'S REPORT - A NEW HOPE Creavery Lloyd, Alzheimer's Chair

Dementia is the second largest contributor to death among older Americans, with one in every three seniors dying of Alzheimer's or another dementia. And despite reliable diagnostic tests, evidence shows over half of those with Alzheimer's do not know they have the disease.

Facing these harsh realities, it is crucial that those battling Alzheimer's and their caregivers have access to diagnosis and care planning services. Today our efforts to improve diagnosis care planning, and medical record documentation move forward with the reintroduction of the Health Outcomes, Planning and Education (HOPE) for Alzheimer's Act. This legislation is one of the Alzheimer's Association's most important legislative priorities in the 113th Congress.

HOPE for Alzheimer's Act focuses on three key areas by:

- Creating a package of services aimed at a formal and documented diagnosis.
- Ensuring that comprehensive care planning services are provided after a diagnosis to Medicare beneficiaries and their caregivers.
- Requiring documentation of a diagnosis and any care planning services in the beneficiary's medical record.

In the last session of Congress, the HOPE for Alzheimer's Act garnered 173 co-sponsors and wide, bipartisan support in both the House and Senate. We need your help to build and maintain bipartisan support for passage of this critical legislation!!

Recent Activities by our Federation Legislative Committee

The Maryland legislative committee, chaired by Ed Bice, met several times this year to monitor what our state politicians are doing for us this year and to encourage legislation on our behalf. Among the bills under consideration are Senate Bill 23 and House Bill (HB) 578 dealing with income tax credit for long term care (LTC) insurance premiums. These bills have now been heard by committees, but no votes have been taken as of yet. HB 578, sponsored by Delegate Jim Hubbard (Dist 23), would replace the one time \$500 tax credit with an annual \$200 credit on payments for LTC insurance beginning in 2014 on new policies. Bice reports that both bills have strong support by the SLC based on the number of co-sponsors on the bills, but getting money bills out of the Ways and Means Committee has been problematic.

The SLC is also encouraging passage of at least 3 other bills important to NARFE folks. Among them is HB 422 that would allow a subtraction of up to \$8,000 on State Income tax for retirement income from an IRA retirement account or annuity. House Bill 509, False Claims Act of 2013 prohibits specified actions against the government, provides penalties for making false claims and authorizes a person or government to file a civil action against a person who makes a false claim. NARFE also supports HB 1044, **Public Funding and Small Donor Act for General Assembly Elections which cre**ates a commission to study public financing of elections and authorizes the Counties to enact laws to regulate campaign finance activities for some county offices.

In other areas, our NARFE representative to the United Seniors of MD (USM) Chuck Thomas, reports that its legislative committee has reviewed and testified on a wide variety of proposed legislation that impact MD seniors.
