HOUSE HEARING EXAMINES VALUE OF FEHBP Dr. Howard Waterworth, 1st Vice President and Legislative Chair

he House Oversight and Government Reform subcommittee is determining whether the Federal Employees Health Benefits Program is a good value for federal workers. They heard from witnesses including the OPM, and discussed how to improve the FEHBP, which was described as a model health insurance program for the nation. NARFE President Joseph Beaudoin submitted testimony, highlighting the importance of the FEHBP and noting that NARFE wants to ensure that the program continues.

OPM proposes to introduce regional preferred provider organizations (PPO) as a way to increase competition and lower costs. NARFE agrees but only if the change does not lead PPOs to "cherry pick" healthy young patients, which would in turn raise costs for nationwide plans and seniors.

Another proposal concerned whether OPM should have more authority to contract directly with pharmacy benefit managers to purchase prescription drugs. which OPM states would more efficiently leverage the federal government's purchasing power. The subcommittee also discussed ways to modernize the FEHBP. including creating a "self plus one" enrollment category. Currently, FEHBP enrollees choose between self-only or family coverage, meaning that a family with 3 or more members pays the same premiums as a two-person household. NARFE supports this idea if it would lower the cost for retirees but would not if retirees on fixed incomes would be forced to pay more for the same coverage because retirees represent a higher risk pool. OPM also proposed allowing adjustments to premiums based on tobacco use or enrollment in a wellness program. While NARFE supports incentivizing healthy habits through premium differentials, it has concerns about whether it would infringe on privacy. In addition, OPM proposed expanding the FEHBP to domestic partners including both opposite and same-sex couples. Changes should be made only after establishing pilot programs and allowing time for public comment.

A bill (H.R. 1367) would expand federal oversight of prescription drug benefits provided to federal employees, annuitant's and their families and it would regulate pricing in an attempt to prevent anti-competitive practices from pushing drug prices upward. NARFE supports the bill as well as other efforts aimed at ensuring fair prescription drug contracting and pricing to keep costs for participants and taxpayers under control.

This legislation would require that pharmacy benefit managers who currently contract with individual insurance plans to provide FEHBP prescription drug benefits. return 99% of all rebates, market share incentives and other monies received from pharmaceutical companies for FEHBP business. And the legislation would prohibit "drug switching" without prior physician approval; it would impose new disclosure and requirements on Pharmacy Benefit Managers in line with industry trends, and cap prescription drug prices paid by the FEHBP at the amount of the average manufacture price.

The H.R. 1367 is similar to previous bills from which the OPM has adopted many of the requirements into its standard feefor-service and experience-rated health maintenance organization contracts.

Forcing federal employees, retirees and survivors to pay more for health insurance premiums will make it unaffordable for some, says NARFE. Under a current proposal our premium contribution would shift from 30% to 43%, an increase of \$2850 by 2020.

THE MERGING OF A CHAPTER - History of NARFE Chapter 264 by Jana Over, Chapter 264 Treasurer, Newsletter Editor and Membership Chair

NARFE Chapter 264, 60 years old in 2013, was chartered on June 10, 1953, under the parent organization, the "National Association of Retired Civil Employees". As is often the case with volunteer organizations, frequent leadership changes occurred and a compiled record of Chapter 264 leaders, activities and sponsored actions does not exist. I am therefore very grateful to Susan Pellant. daughter of Erma Pellant (1923 - 2013), for saving Erma's small collection of Chapter 264 documents for me. This short article would have been impossible without Erma's wellorganized files. The website holding Erma's Memorial Mass booklet and Eulogy (which includes her experiences as a long-time volunteer) mav be found at http:// www.stproductions.org/Erma/Erma.htm .

Chapter 264 began with 54 members in 1953 and grew to well over 1000 members by the 1970s. While Chapter membership was still high in 1996 at 874, 20 years later, in 2013, membership had shrunk to approximately 250 members. These numbers do little to showcase the vibrancy of the early decades of Chapter 264, which our oldest members remember and often revisit in stories told at chapter meetings.

Hundreds of volunteers across 60 years kept Chapter 264 alive and vibrant. Erma's 1990s newsletters are full of comprehensive articles on pending legislation, NARFE Maryland Federation and Headquarters actions, timesensitive guidance for federal employees and meticulous meeting minutes. Prior to the advent of the internet, these detailed chapter newsletters were a vital and valuable communications tool, keeping members wellinformed on critical issues of the day.

Early Chapter 264 meetings and luncheons were very well attended by hundreds of members and spouses. By the 1990s attendance averaged around 75 people, and gatherings were held at a wide variety of locations including the First United Methodist Church at Queens Chapel and Belcrest Road, the Golden Bull Restaurant, the Anchor Inn, the Argyle Country Club, Riversdale Mansion, Prince George's Plaza Community Center and College Park Community Center. During the 1990s, dozens of local politicians and speakers from federal service providers spoke at meetings and luncheons, as well as local celebrities such as Mike Causey, Washington Post columnist, and artists such as Naba Singha, a master musician and dancer from India.

Chapter 264 actively engaged with the local community. In 1995, NARFE Chapter 264 and the Franklin and Eleanor Roosevelt Institute arranged for the planting of a Redbud tree at the Hyattsville Public Library, in commemoration of the 50th Anniversary of the death of President Franklin Delano Roosevelt. In 2014, the Hyattsville Library building is slated for extensive renovation. Perhaps the newly merged chapters 264 and 1122 can sponsor another tree planting?

Chapter 264 was also very active in NARFE Marvland Federation and National Conventions. For example, at the May 1996 mini-convention, Chapter 264 submitted a resolution to change the NARFE name to reflect membership eligibility for ACTIVE as well as retired employees. A 1996 Chapter 264 newsletter states that this resolution was defeated by the convention. The chapter newsletter article is unclear, however **Chapter President James Keefer may** have sent the proposal to NARFE Headquarters anyway. Perhaps Chapter 264 led the way in encouraging the "future" name change to National Active and **Retired Federal Employees?**

Chapter 264 has had a long, successful history supporting NARFE goals. Current Chapter 264 members well remember the important work done by Chapter 264 since 1953 and look forward to a vibrant future as Chapter 264 merges with Chapter 1122.
