NARFE". It runs 50 pages but, if you do nothing
else, you MUST read the Executive Summary, just
three pages. It should frighten you, as it does three pages. It should frighten you, as it does me, because we have only a very few number of years before NARFE will cease to exist if we don't make serious changes in how we

conduct business.

Here are "the NARFE strategic plan objectives which were created to guide the governance and management of NARFE through the next two challenging years:

- 1. Transform governance to be more efficient,
- effective, agile, consistent, and accountable.

 2. Bolster NARFE's brand to increase awareness, eliminate confusion, and convey the value of NARFE.
- 3. Stabilize and grow membership to support effective advocacy and to deliver financial stability.

Unfortunately, "Continuation of the status quo at NARFE will not return the organization to healthier financial footing, especially if there are no membership increases or a greater percentage of revenue from non-dues sources. Looking ahead, the trends that have brought NARFE to its current situation will lead to more financial distress." HEALTH COVERAGE (IRS FORM 1095B) -Irving Shapiro

This form certifies to the IRS that the tax payer and any dependents claimed on his/her tax returns had the **minimum level** of **health insurance coverage** for 2015 as required under the Affordable Care Act. The 1095B forms are the responsibility of the health plans which should have sent one to the IRS and one copy to their enrollees. Retirees who received a form 1095B and found a mistake on it need to contact their health plan - **not OPM**. <u>health plan - not OPM.</u>
