BUILD RETIREE POWER

Since being elected President of the Maryland Federation, I have had laser focus on Educating and Empowering our members on the opportunities to improve their skills as grassroots activists and to learn more about retirement security issues, by bringing in expert speakers on Social Security, Medicare and other retiree issues with focus on the opportunities and challenges we will face in 2019.

Over the last year we have had unprecedented engagement with our elected officials. During the summer, Dr. Sudha Haley and I visited chapters on our Spotlight Tour 2018, talking about sound solutions to the multi-employer pension crisis and ensuring that elected officials hear our voices on the matter.

Our Profiles in Civil Service Golden Edition 2019 - Tell Us Your Story will consist of profiles from the Maryland, District of Columbia, Virginia and Pennsylvania Federations. Storytelling is the foundation upon which we build retiree power. Don't think you have a compelling firsthand story? You would be surprised. We want to listen and understand why you think retirement security is an issue worth fighting for.

At our upcoming 2019 Biennial Conference in Ocean City, Maryland, you will hear from dynamite speakers such as AFGE National President J. David Cox Sr.; Dr. Adam Robinson, Director of the Department of Veterans Affairs Health Care System; National Association of Letter Carriers National President Rolonda Fredrick; Postal Service, Alliance for Retired Americans Executive Vice President Jo Etta Brown; NARFE National NARFE President Ken Thomas; and Grand Alliance Partners. There will also be many workshop presenters from various organizations.

We plan to hold a successful new voting process for electing new Maryland Federation Officers this coming year of 2019. We are under the new system of One Member One Vote. All voting is by members by ballot with one vote each. Ballot vote by membership is required for the election of Maryland Federation Officers, National Officers and RVPs. I have called a Special Meeting of the EXCOMM to discuss this important matter at hand on Dec. 4, 2018.

Our opponents continue to claim that the wealthiest earners and CEOs need more tax breaks, and that we should cut Social Security and Medicare to pay for it. That's outrageous. We must remain steadfast in our core beliefs and continue to confront our opponents head on.

Let's build on what we have accomplished. As we saw in the midterm elections and throughout the year, the voices of seniors and active and retired federal employees will never be silenced.

LEGISLATIVE REPORT





Is your Chapter President inviting us to one of your 2019 Chapter meetings? **Federation President Dr. Gary Roundtree Sr.** and I are moving forward on our **Chapter Spotlight Tour.** In 2018, we visited Chapters 126; 251; 258; 306; 422; 969; 1143; 1260; 1363; 1372; 1466; 1522; 1887; 1892; 1972; 1936; and 2262 by invitations from Chapter Presidents. We have accepted invitations in 2019 on February 11, for Chapter 1888, from President **Marcia Swanson**; on April 18, Chapter 1747, President **Frank Lee**; April 23, Chapter 1127, President **Jennifer Ramsey**; and April 29, Chapter 1770, President **James Wood**.

As indicated in my last Newsletter message, our Chapter Spotlight Tour is to pay attention to each member and gain insights for the future of our Maryland Federation. What shift in our Federation's Mission, Focus, and Priorities should your Federation leadership be pursuing for real and sustainable improvements? We have already resolved several critical issues raised by Chapter members during our visits. Still in process are changes on the membership application form and Chapter Presidents obtaining the list of National members, among other concerns.

On your behalf, we continue rigorous communications with our Lawmakers and their staffs including visits to Capitol Hill and Annapolis. We brought to you **Congressman Jamie Raskin's Chief of Staff Julie Tagen** (former NARFE National Legislative Director). She presented and described several bills in Congress, and particularly the leadership of Congressman Raskin and our Maryland Lawmakers to provide a pay increase for our active federal employees.

It was indeed a mega thrill at our October Board meeting, when our Maryland Federation hosted one of the highest-ranking Congressional Leaders, **Democratic Whip (soon to be Majority Leader) Congressman Steny Hoyer (MD-05)**. We attribute his presence to our energized advocacy efforts, including letters to the editors written by our Public Relations Director **Barry Grier** and St. Mary's Chapter President **Boyd Loflin.** We sealed the deal through our collaboration with Congressman Hoyer's staff: **Delegate Jazz Lewis; District Director Betsy Bossart; and Legislative Director Keith Abouchar**. Our Champion Congressman Hoyer informed us of legislation he was proposing and sponsoring that continues to protect and enhance our pay and benefits. Congressman Hoyer even extended his time with us to patiently respond to our Board members' questions. [Please note photo of our Federation officers, including new **Region II Vice President Kathy Adams** who said it was among the best meetings she has ever attended in the Region!]

For our Training Day on October 26, we brought in Senator Chris Van Hollen's Policy Advisor Harry Stein. He described the status of some of the legislation critical to our needs, especially Social Security 2100 Act: S. 2671, which Senator Van Hollen has cosponsored. Our Federation Treasurer Dr. Dick Strombotne provided Mr. Stein with his insights on this legislation, which makes comprehensive improvements to the Social Security program. On Training Day, we also disseminated a form for Chapter Presidents to share with members and return data to our Federation Secretary Patricia Farmer. Your information would recommend the best speakers for future Chapter meetings across our Federation. All these free Speakers' expertise and contact information will be published in our forthcoming Handbook for Chapter Presidents.

As you have surmised from above, our meetings are inspiring and energizing. I therefore urge each of you to plan to attend future Federation Board meetings, Training and Conferences. If you are eager to learn more about pending Legislation, contact and join our Federal Legislative Chair Dr. Bruce Fowler and State Legislative Chair Paul Schwartz as they interact with our Lawmakers on Capitol Hill and in Annapolis. Definitely plan to participate in our Federation's "Crusade to Capitol Hill" on March 13, 2019, and register for the NARFE National Legislative Conference (LEGcon19) in Virginia, on March 10-13.

We thank all the productive NARFE-PAC Chapter Coordinators, our unsung heroes, for their successful mobilizing of NARFE-PAC donors. In addition, we are grateful to our members for generously contributing, so we can continue to elect lawmakers who deliver on NARFE issues. Most of all, we want to warmly welcome to our Federation our National Leader **NARFE National President Ken Thomas.**

STATE LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE (SLC) REPORT

Are you angry yet? No? Well if you are a Maryland taxpayer who ordinarily had itemized deductions on your Maryland state tax returns, then you should be!

Who should you be angry with, you ask? The answer to that question is: With your elected officials in Annapolis who failed to protect you from the tax hike imposed on your 2018 state income taxes resulting from the federal tax plan passed last year and effective on your 2018 taxes.

It's not as if there weren't some bills submitted that attempted to do just that. There were bills that called for decoupling state deductions from federal deductions. Currently, because itemization at the state level is tied to the Federal Schedule A, if you take the now increased standard deductions on your Federal return, you are precluded from itemizing on your Maryland state return. These bills never made it out of committee during the 2018 legislative session in Annapolis. As well, neither did bills designed to put back many of the middle-class tax deductions at the state level that were removed in the federal tax plan.

Another manner in which to mitigate the increased state tax burden for those who ordinarily itemized would have been to simply raise the standard deduction at the state level. This they did, but nowhere near the level needed to counter the increased state tax burden. The legislation that was passed to increase the state standard deduction amounts to an extra \$20 to \$40 per taxpayer. To that, I say, don't spend it all in one place.

As I have written in the past, this is your money, not the state's. Whatever small benefit you might see at the federal level was not intended to be swallowed up by the state. The windfall for the state coffers were estimated to exceed the \$500 million mark of which the state had no difficulty finding places on which to spend it.

Certainly, this is not a problem that will cease to exist after just one year. Until it is addressed, Maryland taxpayers will continue to experience the state tax hike year after year after year. Moreover, the longer it takes to fix the injustice, the more used to the windfall and the spending ability that comes with it will be our elected officials.

This issue is, more than anything, a math issue. If you deduct less, you pay more. If you deduct more, you pay less. If any legislator tells you the reason legislation was not passed is because "It is too soon," suggest they retake high school math.

Why, then, did your legislators really fail to correct this easily correctable problem with the bills submitted during last year's legislative session you wonder? Well, here is a response to that very question from just one of your state delegates, Geraldine Valentino-Smith: "As you may be aware, there were bills, introduced during the 2018 legislative session, which would have allowed Marylanders to itemize their deductions on their State returns even if they did not on their Federal returns. The Ways and Means Committee received guidance from Comptroller Peter Franchot's office and the Maryland Association of Certified Public Accountants (CPAs) who warned that there are administrative complexities in doing so. Particularly relating to the State's ability to piggyback off of Federal IRS tax audits and that it could be confusing for the overall majority of Maryland taxpayers. After receiving that advice from the Comptroller's Office and the Association of CPAs, the Committee did not pass the bill."

Let me translate this explanation for you. What is being said is that the reason for the failure of the legislation to be passed is because the Comptroller said that he needs more staff to take on the additional work that would be created if itemizing at the state level was no longer based on the Federal Schedule A.

Okay, HIRE MORE STAFF NOW and you can even take some of the windfall to pay for it. (On the other hand, now that there will be significantly less itemization at the state level, does that not free up current staff to take on more work?)

Bottom line? There is power in numbers and if you want this injustice fixed, you, every one of you, must raise your voice and make your concern heard by the very elected officials who turned a blind eye to fixing it last year. If you do not make it clear to your legislators that you take this issue seriously and will hold them accountable for not protecting your interests, they won't.

How do you make your concerns raised to your legislators? Well, thanks to your State Legislation Committee that task has been made quite simple. Google "MD NARFE", click on the "Maryland Federation of NARFE" and then click on "Legislative – State Page" in the upper right-hand corner. You will then have access to an abundance of important information on this tax issue as well as "What you can do about it." The "What you can do about it" link will enable you to directly contact your elected officials in Annapolis, as well as provide you with a sample letter that can be used in the process. It is REALLY user friendly.

Time to get angry and time to express that anger in a productive manner. Go for it! The money you save will be your own.

SCAM ALERT:

Federation and Chapters Officers, especially Treasurers, please be aware of people who are trying to scam you out of money through email. Someone posing in email as your Federation or Chapter President sends an email requesting you to provide him/her with a check for a certain amount of money. The email address shows your president's name but the underlying email address is not his or hers. If you want to make sure it is the correct address for your president, hover your cursor over the sender information and it will give you the real underlying address of the scammer. Take precaution and by no means send any money without verifying that the request is legitimate.

One specific change noted by Cynthia D'Amour, a featured MBA speaker at FEDcon18, was in the "Care and Feeding of (our Chapters') members - so that they can go out and protect our (hard-earned) federal benefits." She advocated "Shifting-Up our Chapter meetings" with changes; "Don't have same event, same month each year" and "Help (your Chapter members) build relationships with each other -- keeps them coming back."

At our Oct. 26, 2018, Maryland Federation Training Day, Ms. Richards' dynamic "Chapter Meeting Change Exercise" showed: New Meeting Design Elements (I.e., Topic, Focus, Title, Learning, Helping and How To Make It Fun) - experiences that "WOWED US ALL" when we heard them recited, aloud!

Some additional Leadership and Development advice and ideas given by Ms. D'Amour were: "Allow others to play (No martyrs); Ensure (your Chapter) members are heard - listen and then give them what they want; Ask What did we accomplish today? KATHY ADAMS REGION II VICE PRESIDENT



Hi Maryland NARFE members: I am the new Region II Vice President as of November 1, 2018. I have been a NARFE member since 2000. I have served as Treasurer, First Vice President, then President of my Chapter for eight years. I also completed four years as Delaware's Federation President.

I was born in Honolulu, Hawaii, on the island of Oahu.

I am looking forward to working with all of you as a team that will move NARFE forward in the near future. Here are some items that may interest you.

- a. Ken Thomas gained the largest number of points and has been elected as the National President of NARFE for 2018 2020. Also, the new Region I RVP is Jim Risner.
- b. The Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) for 2019 is as follows: CSRS retirees and Social Security recipients will receive 2.8% in their benefits next year. Because the COLA is greater than 2% but less than 3%, FERS retirees will see a 2% increase in their annuities next year.
- c. Maryland currently has 6,420 non-members and 8,183 chapter members, for a total of 14,603 members as of October.
- d. As of September 30, 2018, the NARFE fundraising total for Alzheimer's is \$12,836,372.84.

Here are some notes from my first National Executive Board (NEB) Meeting:

The first meeting for the 2018 - 2020 National Executive Board (NEB) was held at NARFE HQ from November 28 through November 30, 2018. There were six new individuals joining the NEB for the first time. (Many portions of the meeting were conducted in Executive Session).

The meeting began with a presentation by NARFE Attorney Eileen Johnson on the importance of Confidentiality/Non-Disclosure Agreements and a presentation by NARFE Parliamentarian on the proper use of Robert's Rules of Order and the establishment of special and standing committees. We also had a presentation by Federal Employee Education and Assistance (FEEA) Executive Director Joyce Warner on the status of the FEEA Scholarship and Disaster Fund and the future relationship between NARFE and FEEA.

SVP Jessica Klement gave us an update of the Advocacy Department. Postal Reform was discussed and they are working to introduce legislation to provide FERS retirees with the same COLA as CSRS retirees. NARFE PAC more than doubled its contributions from NARFE members resulting in \$920,000 in contributions.

SVP Helen Mosher provided an update on the efforts of the Communications Department. The update primarily addressed efforts to expand the awareness of NARFE within the Federal employee community.

SVP Johann Castro gave us an excellent budget review explaining revenue and expenses for all departments. Membership dues revenue and non-dues revenue was discussed in depth. He also provided an update on the Association Management Support System (AMS), which begins early 2019.

The NEB also discussed increased access to the NARFE database of National-Only members by Federation Officers. NARFE will be a 100-year Association in 2021. If any member would like to serve on the Centennial Committee, please let me know.

Federation Presidents accepted the new application forms.

The next NEB meeting will be help March 8 - 10, 2019 at the Hilton Alexandria Mark Center in Alexandria, Va., prior to LEGcon19 (National Legislative Training Conference). Don't forget to register!

I would personally like to wish all of the members of NARFE/MD a very happy and healthy holiday. Be safe. See all of you in 2019!

TREASURER'S REPORT

Federation Finances as of October 31, 2018. At the start of 2018, the Maryland Federation's net assets totaled \$102,042. As of October 31, 2018, they totaled \$93,846 for a year-to-date deficit of \$8,196. The most significant revenues came from ten-percent funds (\$41,766). See detailed summary in table below.

Net Assets. The Federation's net assets as of October 31, 2018 included: Bank of America Checking - \$6,353.15 and B of A Savings - \$87,493.21. Net assets total \$93,846.36 (inFirst FCU account was closed in January 2018 and assets transferred to B of A Savings. The B of A certificate of deposit matured on April 5, 2018 and assets were transferred to B of A Savings.)

SECRETARY'S REPORT

I am giving up my Secretary's Report space to provide you with an article on the Maryland Federation's new voting process for One Member – One Vote (OMOV). In this newsletter, there is also a formal call for nominations for officers and a formal call for proposed Bylaws/Resolutions as well as a timeline for the voting process. Please read them.

NARFE/MD NEW VOTING PROCESS One Member – One Vote (OMOV) Starts in 2019

The approval of the Federation Bylaws changes at the 2017 MD Federation Mini-Convention was the end of delegate voting for transacting the business of the MD Federation. One Member - One Vote provides each member of the MD Federation and National Only members who live in Maryland the opportunity to cast a ballot for election of officers, bylaws changes and resolutions.

To implement this change, 2019 voting will be done by paper ballot. For all MD Federation members and National Only members who have email, the ballot will be sent to you by email for you to print, fill out, stamp and return by postal mail based on instructions on the ballot. For the MD Federation members and National Only members in Maryland who do not have an email address, you will request a paper ballot be sent to you for voting. Information on how to request your ballot will appear in the February 2019 issue of the *narfe magazine*. In order for your vote to count, you must sign the ballot and provide your NARFE member ID number. These ballots must be returned in a timely manner and postmarked no later than April 15, 2019 for your vote to count. Detailed instructions will be included in the ballot you receive.

An Election 2019 Page will be set up on the Maryland Federation's website www.mdnarfe.org for information about the election and balloting. An announcement about the link will be sent out as soon as possible.

A formal call for both Nominations and Bylaws/Resolutions is included in this newsletter.

The slate of candidates, proposed bylaw changes and resolutions will be available by March 1, 2019 and will be included in the final version of the ballot by March 5, 2019. The final ballot will be provided to the Ballot and Teller Committee. Next, the slate of candidates, proposed bylaw changes and resolutions will be published by March 22, 2019 in the Maryland Federation Spring Newsletter and Emailed through the NES (NARFE Email System).

The 2019 ballot will be printed and mailed by March 25, 2019 to those members without email addresses who have sent a self-addressed stamped envelope and requested a ballot for voting. On the same date, a ballot will be emailed to members who have an email address. Those members are requested to print the ballot, fill it out, sign it and return it as directed. To vote, you must mark your ballot, affix a postage stamp to the self-addressed ballot, and mail it on or before April 15, 2019.

The Ballot and Teller Committee will receive and count the ballots in time for the Federation President and Ballot and Teller Committee Chair to jointly announce the results by May 1, 2019. The new Federation Officers will be installed at the Biennial Conference on May 6. Full coverage of our first federation-wide ballot voting will be included in the 2019 Fall Newsletter.
