Maryland Legislative Update Shelly Ziman

Medical Aid-in-dying Bill, aka Death with Dignity, aka End of Life Option Act

The Maryland legislation was modeled after an Oregon law that applied to terminally ill patients whose doctors say they have six months or less to live. Patients would have to make three requests to end their lives, both oral and in writing. Similar statutes have been enacted in DC, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Montana, Oregon, Vermont, and Washington. In DC, at least two terminally ill patients have legally ended their lives since their law took effect in 2017. Maryland residents are not eligible to use the DC law.

The Maryland bill, with 60 cosponsors, failed after the House of Delegates voted 74-66 in favor while the Senate deadlocked 23-23. Many Catholic and African American lawmakers voted against the bill. In contrast, according to a 2016 Purple Strategies poll, 65 percent of Maryland voters support medical aid in dving, including a majority of African-Americans (59%), Republicans (56%), Catholics (53%), and a plurality of voters who attend religious services weekly (46%). The Catholic Church opposed the bill.

Advocates claimed that the detailed requirements of the bill imposed so many roadblocks that few, if any, doctors or patients would likely opt to take advantage of an associated law.

The bill, if passed, would have given mentally capable, terminally ill adults with six months or less to live the option to get a doctor's prescription for medication they can take if their suffering becomes unbearable, so they can die peacefully in their sleep. The bill was supported by the United Seniors of Maryland and a host of other organizations, citing the importance to end needless suffering.
