

2012 Legislative Program of Maryland NARFE Howard Waterworth, Ist Vice President and Legislative Chair

he Marvland Federation of Chapters represents more than 128,000 federal employees and 145,000 federal annuitants living in Maryland. Maryland's 65+ population is expected to grow from 708,000 to 1.3 million by 2030. The rate of growth for this group is five times the rate of the general population. Thus, there is an urgent need to find new solutions to the challenges posed by an expanding older population in one of the highest cost areas in the nation. Many seniors are struggling to age in place and maintain an acceptable standard of living as their situation is made worse by the impact of the national financial crisis on savings, investments, and home values.

Maryland needs to create an environment that will encourage seniors to stay in Maryland. Seniors pay taxes, which help pay for infrastructure. They generate up to 3 jobs per capita. They donate to community services at almost double the national median for all ages (96 hours vs. 52 hours). Their volunteering in libraries, schools, hospitals, theaters and non-profit venues provides a large unpaid work force, which helps extend city, county and state budgets. Some states openly encourage senior immigration by offering tax incentives.

Maryland NARFE wants to provide tax relief to seniors by closing the unfair income tax gap between certain classes of seniors, by establishing property tax rates that will enable them to age in place, and by providing an annual \$200 deduction for purchase and retention of long term care insurance.

EQUALIZE TAX EXEMPTIONS FOR SENIORS. IN 2007 a law was enacted in MD that allowed taxpayers to claim a special exemption of \$3200 for the care of non-spousal dependents over 65. In contrast, the exemption for elderly taxpayers and their spouses has remained at \$1,000 for over 20 years. The \$2,200 difference costs senior taxpayers about \$175 more in taxes every year, or over \$1600 in additional income since 2000. NARFE's goal is to equalize the two exemptions beginning in 2014 that will allow all seniors to receive the same tax benefits.

LONG TERM CARE: Alzheimer's and other mental and physical conditions requiring institutional care will increase as our population of seniors increases. Most will not have adequate funds to cover cost of care; 66% of residents in Maryland nursing homes are on Medicaid, which is above the national average. So another NARFE goal is to convince the Maryland legislature to

encourage the purchase and retention of long term care insurance and to replace the current law which allows a one time \$500 tax credit, with a new law allowing an annual \$200 tax credit on policies purchased in 2013 or later.

REDUCE SENIOR HOMEOWNERS PROPERTY TAXES: The collapse of the housing boom, which drove up property values, has resulted in a large decline in home values. Some jurisdictions have increased their property tax rate to make up for the drop in revenue due to lower assessments, which for some has resulted in paying the same or higher taxes. This has resulted in some emigrating from Maryland to a more seniorfriendly state resulting in economic. civic and social losses to Maryland. NARFE seeks to increase the Homeowners Tax Credit (HTC) assessment limit from the current \$300,000 to \$450,000 for eligible homeowners with lower incomes as well as adjust other factors for inflation. NARFE also seeks reassessment of homes in a county when median home sales prices fall by more than 10% from the previous year. And finally we want a statewide cap on the rate of increase for Homestead Tax Credits to 5% from the current 10%.

OTHER AREAS OF SUPPORT: NARFE will work on behalf of bills to: 1) equalize tax exemption for pensions of public service employees and military retirees,

2) broaden the False Claims Act,

3) institute open government, and4) initiate public funding of candidates for the General Assembly.

 ${\sf A}$ House-Senate Conference Committee, facing a February 29 deadline, will soon begin negotiations on extending the payroll tax The holidav. House passed position asks current and future federal employees to bear a third of the cost of the extension through further pay freeze and increased retirement contribution totaling \$64.5 billion over ten years.
