ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE AND NARFE SUPPORT Dr. Howard Waterworth, 1st Vice President and Legislative Chair

One of the most debilitating and deadly diseases in America is Alzheimer's, which affects primarily older people. More than 5.2 million Americans are living with this disease, most of whom are over 65. It is the 6th leading cause of death in the U.S. One in 3 seniors dies with Alzheimer's, some not even aware they had this disease. And this disease is spreading so that by 2025 some 7.1 million will have it and by 2050 some 13.8 million are projected to have Alzheimer's unless research leads to a way to control it. It is the only cause of death among the top 10 diseases without a way to prevent or cure This disease increased by 68% from it. 2000 to 2010 while deaths from other major diseases have decreased. While the causes of death make it difficult to determine how many people die from Alzheimer's, there are no survivors.

Alzheimer's disease is an irreversible brain disease that slowly destroys memory and thinking skills, and even the ability to carry out the simplest tasks. Furthermore, this disease causes great toll upon the 15.4 million family and friend caregivers who rate their emotional stress as high or very high combined with depression, and additional \$9.1 million health care costs of their own. Nearly 30% of people with Alzheimer's or other dementia are on Medicare or Medicaid compared with 11% without these conditions. There are medications now available that help reduce progression of the disease, but none that cure it.

NARFE has been among the major and longest supporters for the control of this disease. Since 1985 NARFE and Alzheimer's Association have partnered to attain a world without it. Supportive NARFE members to the Alzheimer's International Research Grant Program are making progress toward finding a treatment, prevention and eventual cure for it. NARFE is one of a select number of organizations to belong to the Zenith Society, an elite group of donors who have pledged \$1 million or more to this Association. It began in 1985 when the New Mexico Federation was the first contributor to Alzheimer's research. In 1985-86 the NARFE National Executive Board approved funding the research through contributions from chapters. The initial goal was \$500.000 for research grants. At the same time each Federation appointed a State coordinator and each chapter appointed an Alzheimer's Chair.

In 1987-88 the first National Alzheimer's/ NARFE Control Committee was appointed and the first check for \$500,000 was presented to the Association in 1988 as a research grant. By 1991 \$1 million had been raised. NARFE was committed to solving this disease and began setting goals to attain more dollars for research.

In 1991 NARFE signed on with the distinguished Zenith Fellows Program and a pledge was made to raise \$1 million more in 10 years, a goal that was met in less than 5 years. The research grants elected by NARFE continue to grow each year as new goals are set. In 1998 another goal of \$5 million by 2005 was established and attained in 2003. AND in 2003 a new goal of \$7 million was established by the National Committee which was met in 2007, another new goal in 2007 of \$8 million was approved and fulfilled by February 2009. The current goal is for \$11 million for 2014. As of October 2013 NARFE has already funded a total of 60 researchers since it began in 1985.
